All you need is a tape recorder or a video camera. [ or pen or pencil ]

Being a big advocate of oral histories, I have compiled a list of questions to help you interview family members.

My strong belief in the importance of doing oral histories lies in the fact that because we are such a young country, we don't tend to think in terms of history. I feel that every family's history is unique and should be documented using video cameras and/or tape recorders. It is very easy and fun to do, and duplicate copies are easy to make for backups and/or as gifts for other family members.

We all spend many hours reading about the lives of other people or viewing biographies on TV and in movies, and yet, we easily overlook our own. My personal experience over the past 20 years has taught me that these interviews will eventually become family heirlooms. They will also be invaluable to others who may be researching your family genealogy. I have also found that unfortunately, some of you will put off doing this until it is too late. Family members may pass away and then all this valuable information would be lost forever.

### So, here are some tips:

- 1. Don't put it off! Do it now.
- 2. Have fun doing it, but do take breaks. You won't believe how much information can be recorded on a 2 hour tape, but don't necessarily stop at 2 hours.
- 3. Go with the flow. Ask a million questions beyond my starter questions. Be specific. Ask who, what, where, when, how.
- 4. Bring out old photos and use them as prompts to get the dialogue going. Also, take advantage of this opportunity to write down who, what, where, when on the back of the pictures. Use pencil only because over time, the ink from any other type of pen will bleed through onto the picture.
- 5. Frame your subject in the viewfinder so as to allow room for any movement.

With this questionnaire, I may be including a form which is being used to honor all veterans (back to the Civil War) who resided in Chautauqua County at the time they ENTERED the service, regardless of where they were born or resided prior to that time. This is the only criteria required. This information will then get downloaded into a computer that is housed in a kiosk in the lobby of Jamestown City Hall and which the public can access. Honoring the veterans is an important, worthwhile cause. The kiosk that houses this information, and the monuments at Tracy Plaza are impressive and should be seen.

So, if you have any family member or acquaintance, living or deceased, who served during PEACE TIME OR WAR, please fill out this form to the best your ability and send it to the address at the bottom of the form.

## ADDITIONAL REQUESTS:

I am also involved in personal research of the following:

- 1. The Halicki family, (photos of family members) and business (it's garage, towing and film making)
- 2. The East Town of Dunkirk Fire Hall
- 3. St. Hedwig's school and church in Dunkirk
- 4. The history of the automobile in Chautauqua County, going back to 1900.

As such, I am seeking to borrow and laser print (and/or copy on CD) any photos, film footage (8 mm or video), or information on the topics above, including your personal stories. I would be more than willing to pick up any of these items from you and return them within several days. If you'd prefer not to release your photos to me, I would greatly appreciate your taking them to Copy Boy in Dunkirk or Fredonia, or to Arkwright Printing in Fredonia. They will copy the photos and data for me AT NO COST TO YOU. Just tell them they are being copied for Ron Halicki and they will bill my account. PLEASE LEAVE YOUR NAME WITH THEM SO I MAY CONTACT YOU ABOUT THE PARTICULARS OF THE PHOTOS AND TO THANK YOU.

Regarding #4: This includes items from the past up to the present (anything involving garages, dealerships, gas stations, wrecks, race cars and race tracks, custom cars, sports cars, and drag races at the Dunkirk Airport, just to name a few). Anything relating to the automobile within Chautauqua County would be of great value to me.

When I complete compiling this information, it will be donated in CD format to the historical societies of Chautauqua County. So if someone you know ran a garage or raced, took photos of accidents, or just had a great car, please contact me.

Finally, please keep your historical societies in mind before discarding photos, film, articles, pamphlets, family histories, etc. that may be of interest to them. When in doubt, contact the historical society first and tell them what you have before doing any discarding
